On July 23, 1885, Ulysses S. Grant, General of the Army and 18th President of the United States, passed away, surrounded by his family. His funeral in New York City drew a million and half spectators.

The final resting place of Ulysses S. Grant and his wife Julia, is the largest mausoleum in North America. It testifies to a people's gratitude for the man who ended the Civil War, and then, as President of the United States, strove to heal the nation.
